## SUPPLIES USED TO FRAME A MINIATURE ARTWORK (see framing video at miniartsupply.biz)

To frame a miniature artwork, here are some suggested supplies and suppliers. You can purchase these items from various suppliers such as craft & hardware stores. Some of the items noted are fairly large quantities that will last forever, and I have had my tools for many years.

• Framemaster Point Driver and Points – secures artwork/backing in frame (United Mfrs Supplies: point driver #F07500, points #F08950)

## \*Glazier's Points can also be used to affix work in frame

\*As seen at the beginning of my framing video, pushing the frame up against a hard surface prevents you from putting pressure on the frame corners when using the point driver.

- Paper for back Cover the back of a miniature with paper before adding screw eyes/wire or a triangle hook. Scraps of framers brown paper can be acquired from local framers, or you can use grocery bag paper. A heavy-weight decorative paper, such as marbled paper, is nice.
- Framers Tape, double-sided (1/4 to 1/2") to add paper to back of frame (Blick 54111-1001 or 1002, 1/2")
- Trimming Knife to trim paper around back. You can also cut paper to size with scissors and glue to back.
  (United Mfrs Supplies: trimming knife #645)
- Screw Eyes to use with wire for hanging (United Mfrs Supplies: screw eyes # 730, 217 1/2" or smallest you can find)
- Wire Size #3 for hanging. <u>Vinyl-coated</u> wire makes a big difference; it's much easier to handle. (United Mfrs Supplies: Dura-Lon plastic coated #820, size #3, holds up to 20 lbs.)
- Address label This is a nice final touch on the back of an artwork. You can get special ones printed with your website, pic of an artwork, etc.
